- I. CLEP (College Level Examination Program- sponsored by the College Board) Central Alabama Community College will award credit for satisfactory performance on CLEP tests. CLEP is a national program of credit by examination that offers the student the opportunity to obtain recognition for college level achievement. Upon receipt of official results from a CLEP testing center, Central Alabama Community College will rant credit based on state guidelines and the American Council on Education (ACE) recommendations. - II. Advanced Placement Test (AP) Central Alabama Community College awards credit for advanced placement courses taken in high school with scores of 3 or higher earned on the national examinations of the College Board Advanced Placement Program. Upon receipt of official results, Central Alabama Community College will grant credit based on state guidelines.
- III. Credit for Experience in the Armed Services Central Alabama Community College grants credit for appropriate educational experiences in the armed service in accordance with recommendations from the American Council on Education's Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services.
